<p>Goal: BBE Schools will have all graduating seniors demonstrate their college or career readiness by completing rigorous coursework prior to graduation.</p>	<p>The Class of 2024 had 68% of students accepted and attend a post-secondary college(FY24 was 81%); 29% of students entered the workforce (FY24 was 19%); while 2% of the class planned to serve a military branch. In FY24, BBE students earned 478 (decline of 79) college credits while attending BBE High School. College courses include offerings from Central Lakes e-College, passed Advanced Placement (AP) exams, Online College in the High School, College in the High School and Articulated Courses through our vocational programming.
